- ◆ Encouraging church members to consider long-term service among the Zerma.

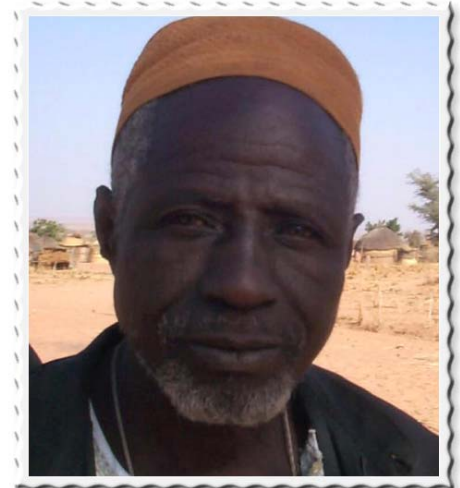


WILL YOU HELP?

Seeking the way...

“God is great! God is great!” The chants of the imam (Muslim religious teacher) penetrate to the farthest corners of the village. He is calling the people to prayer, a ritual that begins each day before dawn. It will be repeated four more times before the day ends, in hundreds of Zerma villages across Niger.

This and many other Muslim practices define who the Zerma are and what they believe.

For the majority of the Zerma people, to be a Zerma is to be a Muslim. To be a Muslim is to be in submission to God, observing the laws and rituals of Islam in obedience to an all-powerful, transcendent God.

...but lacking the truth.

To be a Muslim is to accept Jesus as a prophet, but to reject him as personal Savior. As Muslims, the Zerma are trusting in their “good works” to earn their salvation. To place their faith in Christ for salvation is to reject Islam and its traditions, and thereby face ridicule and rejection by friends and family.

While the rising sun each day brings light and warmth to the land, the vast majority of Zerma people remain in spiritual darkness, having never known the light and salvation that Jesus brings. Join us as we seek to be on mission with God to bring the truth of the gospel to the Zerma people.
